






REVENUE

Celebrating Community Impact: NEMCSA's 2023 Achievements and Honors

One volunteer received special recognition for her extraordinary community service in Roscommon and Crawford counties, contributing over 1,700 hours to various organizations. New Early Childhood Center in Tawas City





In fall of 2022 the new center opened which houses three stateof-the-art Head Start and GSRP classrooms, alongside Early Head Start socialization and childcare areas. Additionally, it houses meticulously designed offices and meeting spaces catering to the needs of teachers, supervisors, and classroom support staff. The center's design prioritizes outdoor play areas and showcases a captivating gymnasium, providing an enriching environment for early learners.

Centralizing our educational resources in Tawas not only fosters financial efficiency through reduced utility and mileage expenses but also enhances support structures for our dedicated staff. Moreover, it streamlines the transition process for families and children while amplifying our presence within the community. The opening of the Tawas Early Childhood Center symbolizes our unwavering commitment to early childhood education and sets the stage for transformative impact in the lives of our youngest learners.

TRUALTA ADDED AS NEW RESOURCE

Region 9 Area Agency on Aging (AAA) has partnered with Trualta to bring an expanded pool of resources to caregivers. Trualta is a free, web-based educational tool available for family caregivers that addresses genuine issues, provides in-depth lessons, practical steps, and guided support.

Trualta helps caregivers learn about health issues, care techniques, and ideas for supporting their loved one more confidently at home. This content is available from any computer, tablet, or smart phone and is developed by licensed professionals with content added every month.

To celebrate the new caregiver platform, Region 9 AAA hosted a free Trualta Kick-off party for family caregivers. A trained specialist demonstrated the platform, helped caregivers get registered, and discussed other caregiver resources.

CAREGIVER EMPOWERMENT AND **WELLNESS CONFERENCE**

Region 9 AAA hosted a Caregiver Empowerment and Wellness Conference in Houghton Lake. Over eighty-six participants attended with nineteen vendor tables.

The keynote speaker was Jill Gafner-Livingston who presented on Caregiver Survival. Other topics included Coping with Change, Grief and Loss, Community Resources, and Stress Less for Mindfulness.

EARY CHILDHOOD SERVICES **INSERVICE STAFF TRAINING**

Over 340 Early Childhood Services staff convened for the annual In-Service event, a two-day training dedicated to professional development and reconnection. This event is crucial for enhancing the skills and cohesion of the staff, ultimately improving the quality of early childhood education and care provided.


