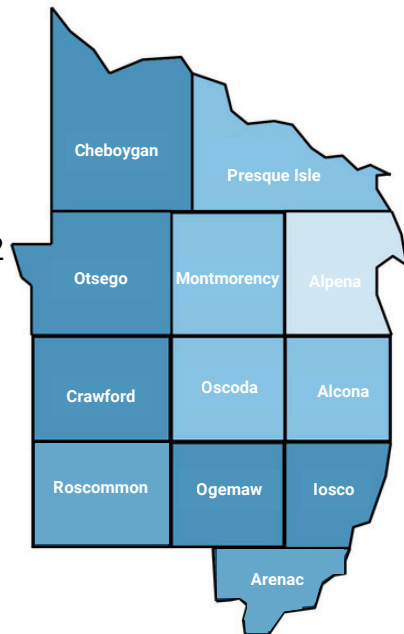

Service designed to locate, mobilize and manage a variety of home care and other services needed by frail elderly persons aged 60 and older at high risk of premature nursing home placement



This program is a long-term care option for the those age 60+ or adults 18 years of age and older who are eligible for a nursing facility level of care.

## Who is Eligible:

Services are available to homebound persons who are 60 years of age or older upon completion of a qualifying assessment.

## What do Services Cost:

Participants are not charged a fee for services. Donations and cost sharing are encouraged to help maintain the program.

## How to Request a Service:

Contact the AAA or COA county for the In-Home Service Coordinator at your local senior center. Referrals are accepted from older adults, family members, physicians, hospital discharge planners, social workers, and concerned individuals.
