About NEMCSA

The Northeast Michigan Community Service Agency (NEMCSA) is a Community Action Agency in northeast Michigan. NEMCSA serves the 11-core counties of Alcona, Alpena, Arenac, Cheboygan, Crawford, Iosco, Montmorency, Ogemaw, Oscoda, Otsego, and Presque Isle. The Region 9 Area Agency on Aging is also administered through NEMCSA, which serves the 11-core and Roscommon Counties.

NEMCSA is a non-profit organization that offers programming with services for every stage of life. Programs are in place to address homeless prevention, food insecurities, foreclosure prevention, homebuyer education, weatherization assistance, self-sufficiency, pregnant women and children, school success, senior services, volunteer programs, and poverty education. With a mission of "Enhancing quality of life by empowering individuals and strengthening communities", NEMCSA strives to be a catalyst to provide solutions to improve the lives of those served and to remain focused on NEMCSA's vision of "Every person is empowered to achieve their fullest potential."

Governed by a tripartite board structure consisting of elected officials, private members, and consumer representatives, the many NEMCSA employees serve roughly 194,000 residents within the 11-core counties. Services are delivered adhering to NEMCSA's Values of dignity, excellence, diversity, and accountability.

Introduction:

The following pages contain selected Social Determinants of Health (SDOH) information and indicators for the NEMCSA 11-core counties and Roscommon County, referred to as the NEMCSA Service Area. Information is also provided at an individual county level. Many of the data sets used are from 2021 as this was the most complete data set available.

According to the U.S. Department of Health and Human Services, Social Determinants of Health "are the conditions in the environments where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks." Five main domains are contained within the SDOH: 1) Economic Stability,

- 2) Education Access and Quality, 3) Health Care Access and Quality,
- 4) Neighborhood and Built Environment, and 5) Social and Community Context. Analyzing the domains, together and separately, creates a picture of the communities in which northeast Michiganders live, work, and play.




NEMCSA 12-County Population Projections 2021 - 2040




In 2021, the largest age group for the NEMCSA 12-county area is age 60-69. That age group projects to be the largest in 2030 and 2040 as well. The 80 and older age group is projected to have the largest growth by 2040, gaining over 8,800 individuals.

The NEMCSA Service Area covers approximately 6,200 square miles in beautiful Northeast Michigan. The Service Area boasts the Huron National Forest, AuSable River, strong farming communities and 1,850 miles of shoreline.

Within the Service Area, of those age 15+, 52.6% of the population was married while 23.3% have never been married.



The NEMCSA Service Area had 22,890 public school students that were being served by 29 public school districts and five intermediate school districts. Of those age 25 and older, 35.88% were a high school graduate or equivalent and almost 30% had either an Associate's Degree, Bachelor's Degree, or a Professional/Graduate Degree. In addition, 1,096 young learners received NEMCSA Early Childhood Services.









Foreign Born Population by County



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




Alcona County's population is trending towards the older age groups over time. This can lead to lower numbers of individuals in the workforce as well as cause strains on systems and healthcare.








Arenac County Population Projections 2021 - 2040






Cheboygan County Population Projections 2021 - 2040





2011 Population Ages 16+ in the Workforce





Economic stability can be defined as the ability to access and afford resources that are essential to one's life and well-being. Healthy People 2030 identifies four key issues that make up the underlying factors for Economic Stability. They are employment, food insecurity, housing instability, and poverty. Each of these has their own effect on the community. An increase in unemployment for an area correlates to an increase in premature death and illness. In addition, health problems can be created by not having enough food or access to healthy foods, housing instability, and poverty.








Percentage of Income Spent on Housing Costs by Amount of Income






