[Provider Feedback Report](#) – used whenever a contracted provider identifies a problem or has a grievance

[Provider Termination Reporting](#) – to report for-cause provider terminations to NEMCSA-Region 9 AAA. For-cause terminations include terminations resulting from non-compliance with program rules, laws, or contract requirements. It is not voluntary and occurs when the provider's conduct, performance, or actions pose a risk to participants, program integrity, or proper use of Medicaid funds.

## **POLICIES:**

[Appeals Policy for Providers](#) – covers appeal rights and process for network providers

[Electronic Visit Verification \(EVV\) Policy](#) – covers EVV requirements for the MI Choice Waiver Program. Applicable to CLS, Respite, and FI providers only.

[Emergency Response Policy for Providers](#) – establishes procedures for subcontracted providers in responding to declared or observed emergencies, including tornadoes, fires, extreme weather (heatwaves, ice storms, flooding), and power outages.

[False Claims Act Policy for Providers](#) – covers the requirements of the Deficit Reduction Act of 2005 which contains provisions to combat fraud and abuse in government health care programs

[Medicaid Provider Manual](#) – MDHHS manual contains coverage, operating standards, reimbursement and billing policies for Medicaid programs. The 95-page MI Choice Waiver section begins on page 1380 of the online document.
