

Weatherization Assistance Program

The Weatherization Assistance Program is funded by the Federal Department of Energy (DOE) and administered by the Michigan Department of Health and Human Services (DHHS). The program provides free energy conservation services for eligible low-income households. DHHS contracts with Northeast Michigan Community Service Agency (NEMCSA) to operate the program in our service area. The Agency determines applicant eligibility, performs the necessary inspections for the Weatherization Program and coordinates all the licensed and insured contractors to complete the work.

Services that may be offered:

- Home Energy Audit
- · Weather-stripping, caulking, general air sealing
- Door repair or replacement
- Window Assessment
- Attic, foundation, wall, or sill box insulation
- · Blower door testing and diagnostics
- Combustion appliance zone assessments
- Programmable thermostat installation
- Furnace tune-up or replacement
- Water Heater assessment or replacement
- Refrigerator assessment and possible replacement
- Quality Control Inspection after the completion of the project

Studies have shown an average of 15% to 40% reduction of fuel usage which in turn will lower your utility bills.

Who may be eligible for these services?

Homeowners and renters who meet the following guidelines:

Household Size	Last 3 months of Gross Income
1 person	\$ 6,440
2 persons	\$ 8,710
3 persons	\$10,980
4 persons	\$13,250
5 persons	\$15,520

Homes cannot be for sale, in foreclosure, or in remodeling at the time of inspection, and homes must be occupied by the applicant. Homes cannot be re-weatherized if they have been served by our program since 2006.
